The Angelina County Lumber Co. Locomotive No. 110 was constructed by Baldwin Locomotive Works in September of 1924. It was used to haul logs and lumber through Angelina County.

In 1970, Locomotive No. 110 was donated to the City of Lufkin by the Junior Chamber of Commerce to be put on display at the Ellen Trout Zoo.

Since the time of its initial placement, the Engine had fallen into disrepair. In 2007, the City of Lufkin began discussing what should become of the Engine, whether it should be moved, donated to another organization or refurbished and continued to be displayed at the Zoo. City Council decided that this Engine was a significant piece of our community's history and made the decision to keep the Locomotive in its current location and restore it to original state. Mr. Simon Henderson also made a substantial monetary donation to assist with the cost of the renovation.

The project was bid in late 2008 and was completed in 2010. The train structure has been repaired and the engine completely repainted. All woodworking and detail work was also refurbished. The Locomotive is now protected from the elements by a covered pavilion. New stairs and railing have been added to allow visitors to see both the inside and out of the Engine. The total cost of renovation was \$91,893.
